PURPOSE

To ensure the school community understands our school's approach to first aid for students.

SCOPE

First aid for anaphylaxis is provided for in our school's Anaphylaxis Policy and asthma in our Asthma Policy.

POLICY

This policy should be read with Morang South's *Administration of Medication, Health Care Needs, Anaphylaxis and Asthma* policies.

From time-to-time staff might need to administer first aid to students at school or school activities.

Parents/carers should be aware that the goal of first aid is not to diagnose or treat a condition.

Staffing

The Principal will ensure that has sufficient staff with the appropriate levels of first aid training to meet the first aid needs of the school community.

Our school's trained first aid officers are listed in our Emergency Management Plan (EMP). Our EMP includes the expiry dates of the training.

This list is reviewed on an annual basis as part of the annual review of our Emergency Management Plan.

First aid kits

Morang South Primary School will maintain:

- A major first aid kit which will be stored in the First Aid room in the office area.
- 8 portable first aid kits which may be used for excursions, camps, or yard duty. The portable first aid kits will be stored:
 - o X 7 in the First Aid room
 - o X 1 in the Paringa Gym Complex

The First Aid officer, Debra Powell or delegate will be responsible for maintaining all first aid kits, ensuring they are managed in accordance with the Department's policy and guidance on first aid kits – refer to First aid kits.

Care for ill students

Students who are unwell should not attend school.

If a student becomes unwell during the school day, they may be directed to the First Aid room and monitored by staff. Depending on the nature of their symptoms, staff may contact parents/carers or an emergency contact person to ask them to collect the student.

First aid room/sick bay area

Our school follows the Department's policy and guidance in relation to our first aid room/sick bay area to ensure it is safe, hygienic and appropriately equipped: <u>First aid rooms and sick bays</u>.

First aid management

If there is a situation or incident which occurs at school or a school activity which requires first aid to be administered to a student:

- Staff who have been trained in first aid will administer first aid in accordance with their training. In an emergency situation, other staff may assist in the administration of first aid within their level of competence.
- Minor injuries only (such as a small scratch) may be treated by a staff member on yard/class duty
- In a medical emergency, staff may take emergency action and do not need to obtain parent/carer consent to do so. Staff may contact Triple Zero "000" for emergency medical services at any time.
- Staff may also contact NURSE-ON-CALL (on 1300 60 60 24) in an emergency. NURSE-ON-CALL provides immediate, expert health advice from a registered nurse and is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- If first aid is administered for a minor injury or condition, Morang South Primary School will notify parents/carers by sending a note home to parents/carers, or where further detail is required by phone.
- If first aid is administered for a serious injury or condition, or in an emergency situation, school staff will attempt to contact parents/carers or emergency contacts as soon as reasonably practical.
- If staff providing first aid determine that an emergency response is not required but that medical advice is needed, school staff will ask parents/carers, or an emergency contact person, to collect the student and recommend that advice is sought from a medical practitioner.
- Whenever first aid treatment has been administered to a student will:
 - o record the treatment through the departments eduSafe Plus system.
 - o if the first aid treatment is provided following a <u>recorded incident</u>, the details are recorded through the eduSafe Plus *Incident* form. For all other presentations, the eduSafe Plus *Sick Bay* form is used.
 - o if first aid was administered in a medical emergency, follow the Department's Reporting and Managing School Incidents Policy, including reporting the incident to the Department's Incident Support and Operations Centre on 1800 126 126 where required to under that policy.

In accordance with guidance from the Department of Education and Training, analgesics, including paracetamol and aspirin, will not be stored at school or provided as a standard first aid treatments. This is because they can mask signs of serious illness or injury. Students requiring regular analgesics due to medical condition will require a Medical Care Plan from a medical doctor. Written permission is also required from parents or guardians to be able to administer any analgesics, including paracetamol and aspirin. In addition to written consent, verbal permission will be required from parents or guardians on the day of administration and details of the phone call will be logged.

It is recommended that all students have personal accident and insurance and ambulance cover. The cost of any medical attention or ambulance for a student will be borne by the parent/guardian.
